# 2024-2025 Health Information and Reminders

## **Medication at School**

Medication forms, which are available at most major clinics and will be available at registration and online, are required for the following:

• All prescription medications that need to be given during school, including inhalers carried by students (must be signed by the parent and the physician).

State statue and school district policy do not permit any prescription medications to be given at school without a written statement signed by the physician and the parent or guardian. This includes the use of inhalers, as well as epi-pens; students may not use or carry any prescription medication without written permission from their physician. Medication needs to be in its original container and properly labeled. Please do not send medication in a baggie or an unlabeled bottle, as it cannot be given.

A new medication form is needed each time the medication is changed, and a new one is needed for each school year.

During online registration, you will be able to sign that certain over the counter medications may be given at school. For scheduled, daily medications, a signed medication form is needed for each medication and for each child. This form must be signed by a parent and the prescribing provider. A separate medication form is needed for each medication and for each child. If you feel your child may need any over the counter medication during the school year, please check with the school nurse for availability. \*Availability is not guaranteed. Please send medications if needed. Over the counter medication may not be stored in backpacks. All over the counter medications that may need to be given during school that are **not** electronically signed off on at registration also require a signed medication form.

Substances that are not FDA approved (i.e. natural products, food supplements) will require the written instruction of a medical practitioner and written consent from the student's parent or guardian.

## **Student Immunization Law** Age & Grade Requirements to enter the 2024-2025 School Year

## Ages Pre-K through 4 years:

4 DTP/DtaP/DT, 3 polio, 1MMR\*\*, 3 Hep B\*\*, 1 Varicella\*

#### Grades K and 1

4 DTP/DtaP/DT (1st dose after 1st birthday), 4 polio, 2MMR, 3 Hep B, 2 Varicella\*

#### Grade 5

4 DTP/DtaP/DT, 4 polio, 2MMR, 3 Hep B, 2 Varicella\*

#### Grades 6-12

4 DTP/DtaP/DT, 4 polio, 2MMR, 1 Tdap, 3 Hep B, 2 Varicella

## \*Note the changes from DHS on the next page for 7th & 12th graders

- \*Varicella is the chickenpox vaccine. Chickenpox disease history is also acceptable.
- \*\*MMR is measles, mumps, and rubella. Lab evidence of immunity is also acceptable for MMR and also for Hepatitis B.

Any student not up to date by the 30th day of school may be excluded from school by state statute. What you need to do to avoid exclusion is:

- Provide school with month, day and year of the required immunizations
- Have your child immunized OR
- Sign a waiver (online & also available from School Nurse office)
- In the event of a communicable disease outbreak, such as measles, children who are not vaccinated are often required to stay home from school and school-related functions until the outbreak ends or they get vaccinated, for their safety.

# 2024-2025 Health Information and Reminders

## Important Vaccine Updates from the School Nurse

On May 20th, 2024, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS 144.01) announced updates to the immunization requirements for children in childcare centers and schools for the 2024-2025 school year.

## **Key Changes:**

- 1. Meningococcal Vaccine Requirement: Students entering 7th grade must receive the MenACWY vaccine, and eligible students entering 12th grade need a booster dose. If you are unsure whether your student meets these requirements, please contact your medical provider.
- 2. Chickenpox Vaccine Exemption: Newly enrolled students can no longer use a parent's report of chickenpox to claim exemption from the varicella vaccine. A diagnosis from a qualified healthcare provider (M.D., D.O., N.P., or P.A.) is required. Past reports by parents of a history of varicella/chicken pox are still valid.
- 3. Existing exemption options in place for all vaccines still apply: Forms can be found on our website by going to "District" > "District Information" > "School Health Services" English Vaccine Record/Waiver, Spanish Vaccine Record/Waiver, Hmong Vaccine Record/Waiver (The exemption portion of this form is at the bottom of the form).
- 4. Outbreak Definitions Update: The definitions of "substantial outbreak" for childcare centers and schools have been revised to align with CDC definitions, including the addition of chickenpox and meningococcal disease.

Once your student has received the required vaccinations, please forward the records to your student's school office to update their information. You may obtain this information on MyChart, directly from your students' provider, or you can find this information Wisconsin Immunization Registry portal for parents. Please send a picture/screenshot to 608-451-1185. Please remember to include your name and the student's name in the message. Alternatively, please fax this information to the appropriate school for your student(s) or email the information to: wsnurses@wsalem.k21.wi.us.

Letters for qualifying families are mailed to the Parent/Guardian(s) on file.

## **Updated Food Service & Fee Management Payment Options**

Our online payment processing vendor, RevTrak, has an updated and streamlined look for paying for school meals and class and activities fees. You will follow the same steps by logging into your Skyward Family Access account and clicking "Fee Management" or "Food Service" and then "Make a Payment."

This will open a new window where you will be able to add money to your lunch account and pay your fees at the same time. Simply click "Food" and select the amount you would like to apply to your account and add to cart. You can repeat the same steps with any Class Fees as well.

There is also a new option called "Auto Replenish" which will add a specific amount you designate to the food service account when the balance reaches a particular amount. This is completely optional. Ex: You set up your student's account to add \$50.00 each time the balance drops below \$5.00.

Once you have all of your food service and fee payments added to your cart, click "Checkout" and proceed to payment.

\*Remember, all service fees are waived through the month of August!
