Letter from Superintendent Ryan Rieber

A Time of Thanksgiving

As I am authoring the November edition of our school newsletter, we are a few short days away from the upcoming election on November 5th. As all eyes have been pointed on this day for some time, there will be a lot of anticipation of what is to come. Henry Ford said, "Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is a success." No matter the election outcomes, I hope we will all be able to work together, as Henry Ford stated. I also want to extend my heartfelt thank you to each of you for taking the time to consider the needs of our school district as you head to the ballot box. With essential decisions on the recurring \$3.5 million operational referendum and looking towards the future with the \$28 million capital improvement question, your careful thoughts on these questions and the future educational opportunities of our students are greatly appreciated. In the December newsletter, I will provide more information on the election's outcomes and what that means from the school's perspective.

This past month, School District of West Salem Transportation Director Rick Kline shared an important transportation update, highlighting a growing issue with vehicles ignoring school bus stop signs—a nationwide problem facing our district and many others. This violation puts students at serious risk. Recently, High School Principal Justin Jehn sent a public service announcement to high school students, educating them on the law and dangers associated with passing a stopped school bus, with insights from Amanda Jackson, the prosecuting attorney for West Salem and Onalaska. Attorney Jackson provided an excellent instructional news clip. This brief instructional video and a graphic on the next page are provided to reinforce these critical regulations. If you didn't know, the fine for passing a stopped school bus is \$691, deducting 4 points from a driver's license. Please remember these safety regulations the next time you see the flashing red lights and stop signs on the buses. It is all of our job to help keep our children safe!


